

# **Quick Guide to CUP e-books Information Skills Practical Workshop**

We have access to approximately 5,000 titles published by Cambridge University Press in electronic format. Subjects covered include all disciplines across science, technology and medicine, as well as humanities and social sciences.

## **Accessing CUP e-books**

- Go to http://ebooks.cambridge.org/
- 2. If you are working off the campus network click on the **Login** link at the top right hand side of the page and then click on **Institutional Login** 
  - a. Select UK Federation, then University of Aberdeen
  - b. Click on the Select button
  - c. Login using your university computer username and password




## **Searching CUP e-books**

#### **Keyword search**


- Type a few search terms into the **Search** box near the top left hand side of the page. If you want to use more flexible searching, click on the **Advanced Search** option
- 2. Your search will retrieve chapters of books that meet your search criteria
- 3. To link to full text, click on the title of the book, the Chapter DOI or the Read PDF link





- 4. The book details are given in full. Click on the **Table of Contents** tab for links to the other chapters in the same book in full text in PDF (see screenshot above)
- 5. NOTE: the full text is available for your own research and study purposes only

#### **Browse Search**



- Click through the subject categories in the Browse by Subject section (see screenshot on Page 1 and opposite).
- Click on the any of the entries under a subject heading to retrieve a list of book titles to browse through (see below).
